

## Facts You Should Know About the Herald of Truth

Our goal is to have the Herald of Truth on the Du Mont Television Network in addition to the radio network by February $12,1954$.

The television target is sixty-two Du Mont television stations.

To make this a reality requires that necessary funds be assured by December 18. 1953.

This goal can be attained by 1,000 congregations pledging $\$ 27.00$ per week to be paid in 1954.

The sixty-two Du Mont stations which we plan to carry the program reach an area comprising $82.29 \%$ of the television homes in the U. S.

The radio time costs us $48 \%$ less than it would if the stations were bought in dividually.

The television time costs us $13 \%$ less than if each station were bought individually.

The television production costs are an average of $77 \%$ less per station than programs produced for individual stations.

With all expense involved of preparing the program, printing and mailing of sermons, handling of correspondence, the cost of the Herald of Truth for radio and television is $42 \%$ less than the time and station production costs of a comparable program on the network stations if bought individually.

An estimated ten million will be reached by the combined Herald of Truth Radio-Television network per week.

It will cost $\$ 2.70$ to reach each 1,000 people with the Herald of Truth Radio'relevision network.

On January 1, 1953, $41 \%$ of all families in the United States had television sets.

The A. C. Nielson Co., research organization, found that $69.3 \%$ of purcharsers interviewed named television as the medium influencing their purchase.

The Herald of Truth is supervised by and under the immediate oversight of the Highland Church of Christ, Abilene, Texas.

Each program is reviewed by the elders of the congregation for approval before broadcast. The Highland Church is simply asking sister congregation to have fellowship with her in this good work.

The speakers are James D. Willeford and James W. Nichols. The program has thirty minutes of gospel songs, reading of scripture, and sermon.

Phil Kendrick, Jr., an outstanding announcer, serves in this capacity for the Herald of Truth.

An estimated 5,000 have been converted in eighteen months as a result of the radio network.

Every contribution is accurately recorded and acknowledged. Our records are kept in such a way that our books may be examined at any time as to the receipts of contributions and disbursement of funds. And in addition to the standard records, special ledger cards are kept for each contributor showing the date and amount of each contribution, so that any time this information might be desired, it can be immediately provided.

The Highland elders have taken every precaution in the handling of funds for the protection of the congregation, the workers, and all contributors.

We must have the funds raised by December 18.

One thousand congregations could easily put this over with an investment of $\$ 27.00$ per week. Will your congregation be one of the 1,000 ?
